



## TextMyGov Announcement

The City of Farmington is expanding its [TextMyGov](#) database to improve local government text alerts, resident notifications, and community updates by SMS. This database addition helps the City deliver more timely, relevant public service information directly to residents' mobile phones.

Starting Wednesday, June 10th the expanded location-based addition will support more targeted text message alerts for road closures, public works, emergency notices, meetings, seasonal reminders, and other important Farmington/Washington County services.

- Road closures, construction, and public works updates
- Emergency notifications and public safety alerts
- Community meetings, service announcements, and local reminders

Residents whose mobile phone information is connected to the City area via mailing address may receive an introductory text from **91896** on behalf of the City. Participation is optional, and residents may opt out at any time by texting **STOP**.

### For Current Subscribers:

Current TextMyGov subscribers do not need to take any action and will continue receiving alerts based on available City services and groups.

### How to Join:

If you do not receive the initial message, sign up by texting "**FARMINGTON**" to **91896**, then reply **YES** to confirm.

Subscribers may receive text alerts about events, meetings, public works, emergency information, and other important City updates.

### Find Information & Report Issues:

Residents can also text one or two keywords to the City's TextMyGov number, **479-268-4746**, to quickly find government information about services, offices, schedules, and community resources.

By expanding the TextMyGov database, the City is making public communication faster, more targeted, and more accessible for residents who want timely local government updates by text message.
